### THE REAL CAMPUS MINISTERS: Students on Mission in the Fall of 2017

There are few things on campus that get us more energized than when we hear of a student actively choosing to share his/her faith on campus. Even though our staff are all called campus ministers, we see students as the REAL ministers on campus. In fact, we can't think of anything more important for them to do once they come to faith than join the CSF community in being about Jesus' ministry at UIS. This year, we've seen God do remarkable things as students have surrendered themselves to Jesus' mercy and mission.

On average, between 50-60 students showed up weekly to CSF's Monday night worship service to worship God. Many of these attenders were intentionally invited by CSF students at their work, in the classroom, or through random acts of kindness on campus. We worshipped with students from Illinois, Wisconsin, and Georgia as well as from India, Nigeria and China.

Well over 200 new students had a significant connection with a CSF student during the first week of school whether at a CSF event or through a student follow up. <u>This comprises nearly 20% of the entire UIS on-campus population!</u>

CSF's 10 Student Leaders each committed themselves to regularly discipling other students who are younger or new to the faith. This pursuit led to our student leaders having weekly discipleship meetings with 8 newer or younger believers and a whole host of other ongoing relationships with students who need to know Jesus.

We're thrilled by how God is at work in His vision for seeing students be disciples who make disciples while on campus and for the rest of their lives. Thank you for the ways you've allowed Him to use you by partnering with CSF!!!


