"Observe how the lilies of the field grow; they do not toil nor do they spin, yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory did not clothe himself like one of these. But if God so arrays the grass of the field...will He not much more do so for you, O men of little faith?" Open our eyes Lord!
