Sunday Worship Service Bible School

Many of us begin the year by starting an annual read through the Bible. There are many plans that can guide you through the Bible in a year, but the one I use is the Daily Reading Bible NASB. It's only available in digital format and can be purchased from Kindle through Amazon for \$5. The thing I especially like about this guide is that it has you reading an OT and NT passage each day, and if you look for it, you can find a connection between them.

I've recently discovered something else that can help you succeed on your journey though the Bible; illustrated overviews of the books of the Bible. They are produced by BibleProject, a nonprofit, crowdfunded organization that makes free resources like videos, podcasts, articles and classes that help people experience the Bible. It was formed ten years ago by a couple of former Bible college roommates. One of them had become a teaching pastor and college professor with a PhD in Semitic languages, and the other founded digital and marketing companies. They decided to combine their talents and love for the Bible to create the BibleProiect.

While everything I've looked at that they've produced is excellent and biblical, I especially like their overviews. They outline the structure of each book and summarize what they contain. The easiest way to find them is to go to YouTube and simply type in Bible Project Overviews. They will look like the illustration I've printed below. How late is too late? My Mom passed through the veil that separates us from our eternal destination on November 11th of this year. I was given the task of being the officiant at her funeral. I had been praying for over a year that the Holy Spirit would give me comfort and strength as I was almost sure that my Mom's final destination would not be heaven. Whenever I had visited my Mom I tried to get her to listen to the gospel message but she would always cut me off and say, "I'm not going to talk about that."

My Mom was in severe pain her last seven months from what her doctors referred to as the worst case of shingles that they had ever encountered. During that seven months, two of my sisters gave 24 hour care to our Mom. My 70 year old baby sister tried to continually talk to her about Jesus. She told me that during her last month of life our Mom started to listen instead of putting a stop to all such discussions. I was told that shortly before her death, Mom told my sister that she just wanted Him to call her home. My sister asked her "who do you mean when you say him?" and Mom responded "God".

My heart leapt with joy! Did Mom finally accept Jesus as her Lord and savior? I won't know till I get to heaven. Only God knows the heart of an individual. Something I have had to continually remind myself of. So, as we come to this time of communion let's celebrate our joy of knowing where we will spend eternity because someone took the time to share the Good News with us.

Whether it was at church or a media program or an individual, the source doesn't matter, only that the seed is planted. Pray for God to water and cause that seed of faith to grow to the point of redemption. Only through the sacrifice of our Lord, which is represented by these symbols of His broken body and spilt blood, can any of us have the assurance of our eternal destination.

Many of you heard my plea for prayer that Mom would open herself up to the Lord, and for that I truly, truly thank you. Let's never guit praying for others to respond to the Good News when they hear it, and remind ourselves that only God knows what is in an individuals' heart.
