

The decision was made on Tuesday that he needed to return to the hospital. We spent the whole day at the hospital and he was admitted in the evenina. The symptoms he was experiencing were not caused by the chemo as we thought. They were due to the damage caused by the cancer in his liver. The cancer has spread to many other parts of his body and is even to his bones. They found from further tests that he has problems with a heart valve also. Surgery is out of the question because of the extent of the cancer. He was transferred yesterday to a hospital where he can receive long-term treatment. The doctors have decided to discontinue the chemotherapy because his body cannot take it. The overall prognosis is not very encouraging. Please continue to pray for Grace and her family as they navigate these days.

Grace had a conversation with her dad about our Lord at home before going to the hospital. He still has a cold heart towards the gospel. I think this is, in part, because sometimes parents cannot hear what their children are saving. This coming week. Grace's former pastor will come to speak with him. He is older than Grace's dad and the Lord may be able to break through the ice with him in this conversation. His name is pastor Tae Dong (pronounced Tay Dong). Please pray that the Lord will work in this conversation and the continued conversations that we have with him. His salvation seems impossible but through Christ, all things are possible. Even a stone-cold heart can be made alive in Christ. Please pray for a miracle.


Grades 1-5 Teachers: Rhonda Luzio & Otto Huber
